In re Complaint of John Doe¹

ORDER

This judicial complaint alleges that the chief judge of this Circuit and the Judicial Conference Committee have violated complainant's statutory, civil, constitutional, and human rights by allowing federal judges to commit crimes and by refusing to address complainant's petitions for review.

The complaint does not specify the crimes that these unidentified federal judges are alleged to have committed, and there is no record that the complainant has heretofore filed a judicial complaint within this Circuit.

Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed as "frivolous [and] lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred." 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); Rules 11(c)(1)(C), (D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States; Eighth Circuit Rules Governing Complaints of Judicial Misconduct and Disability Rule 4(c)(3).

The complaint is dismissed.

¹Under Rule 4(f)(1) of the Rules Governing Complaints of Judicial Misconduct and Disability of the Eighth Circuit, the names of the complainant and the judicial officer complained against are to remain confidential, except in special circumstances not here present.
