## <u>ORDER</u>

This is another judicial complaint filed against the chief judge of this Circuit complaining about his rulings denying the complainant's earlier complaints against other federal judges. The seven-line complaint is barely legible but appears to allege that the chief judge was "involved" in "criminal allegations" against the other judges. This unsupported allegation is so lacking in indicia of reliability that no further inquiry is warranted, and it will be dismissed as frivolous. See 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii); J.C.U.S. Rule 11(c)(1)(C). To the extent the complaint alleges that the chief judge erred in dismissing prior judicial complaints, the proper remedy is to petition for review under J.C.U.S. Rule 18, as the complainant has done.

The complaint is dismissed in its entirety.
