These are judicial complaints filed by a private party against one United States circuit judge and 23 United States district judges.

The judicial complaints contain no allegations of misconduct against the named judges. Instead, the judicial complaints attach numerous exhibits, many of which contain the footer "Birther Confession" and purport to bear a federal case number. Because the judicial complaints are devoid of any allegations or evidence of judicial misconduct, they must be dismissed. *See* Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States Rule (J.C.U.S.) 11(c)(1)(D).
