

Bankruptcy Appellate Panel - Notice of Proposed Rulemaking.

Please be advised that the United States Bankruptcy Appellate Panel for the Eighth Circuit is proposing a new local rule to govern its practice.

The Panel proposes to adopt a new local Rule 8006A - Record and Issues on Appeal. The text of the proposed rule is as follows:

RULE 8006A. Record and Issues on Appeal

The appellant's designation of the items to be included in the record on appeal pursuant to Fed. R. Bank.P. 8006, and the appellee's supplemental designation, should include (in addition to those items specifically referenced in Rule 8006) any exhibits received into evidence in the bankruptcy court to be considered on appeal. The record on appeal will only include those exhibits and other items that are properly designated pursuant to Rule 8006. If the exhibits and other items to be included in the record on appeal appear on the bankruptcy court docket in electronic form, parties shall designate them by filing a list of the relevant bankruptcy court docket numbers. If the exhibits do not appear on the bankruptcy court docket, each party shall file them electronically on the Panel's docket via CM/ECF on or before the date that such party's initial brief is filed.

Comments are invited on the proposed rule. The comment period will close on April 14, 2014.
