PER CURIAM.

Francisco Barraza-Canizales appeals from the sentence imposed by the district court<sup>1</sup> following his guilty plea to distributing methamphetamine in violation of 21 U.S.C. § 841(a)(1). The court sentenced Barraza-Canizales at the bottom of the applicable Guidelines range to 63 months' imprisonment and five years' supervised release. After appellate counsel moved to withdraw pursuant to Anders v. California,

386 U.S. 738 (1967), we granted Barraza-Canizales permission to file a pro se supplemental brief, but he has not done so.

Our review of the record reveals the existence of no nonfrivolous issues. See Penson v. Ohio, 488 U.S. 75, 80 (1988).

The judgment is affirmed. Counsel's motion to withdraw is granted.
